May Shoot

In preparation for the youth field day and Heritage Days, we are printing up brochures. We need help folding them. We will be working on them after the May shoot while the scoring is being done. Anyone who can stay and help will be greatly appreciated. Don't forget, May is long range rifle.

Empty Saddles Shoot

This year the Perry County Veterans' Transportation will be the recipient of the main match proceeds. Also, as we have done in previous years, you can receive a Dag-Nab-It good for a 5 second bonus for each 5 food items or \$5.00 cash you donate to the Perry County Food Bank. There is no limit on the number of Dag-Nab-Its you can get. However, these cannot be used to have a "clean match". Also this year we will sell honorary "clean matches" for \$50.00 and honorary "match winners" for \$100.00. Shooters who buy these would receive a certificate recognizing their donation. These would not affect the true outcome of the match and would be recognized separately from the true match winners and true clean shooters. No "clean match pins" or free shoots would be given for the "honorary clean match shooters. All proceeds of the honorary awards will go to the Perry County Food Bank.

Answer to Last Month's "What's The Call"

The Correct Answer is "C"
The Correct Reasoning is:

1) One Miss for the unfired round in the revolver. As it was NOT under the hammer, it is only a miss.

2) One Minor Safety for loading more than the correct number of rounds in a long gun.

3) One Minor Safety for leaving empty or live rounds in magazine or carrier of the long gun in which it was loaded. NOTE: This rule does NOT apply to revolvers.

Minor Safety penalties can "stack up" in a single stage, as opposed to Procedurals (only one per stage)

If the shooter had realized that only 9 rounds were required for the stage (at some point) the 10th round could have been ejected (or fired safely downrange). The penalty for "overloading" in the first place would still apply.

4) One Procedural for shooting the pistol targets in the wrong sequence. P1,P1,P2,P2,P3,P3,P4,etc.

The correct sequence would be P1, P2, P3, P4, P5, P1, P2, P3, P4, P5, P3

Applicable rules:

When a stage calls for 10 pistol rounds in a single sequence or the use of only one pistol for the stage, the Gunfighter may draw both pistols and engage the targets.

The Gunfighter shall shoot the targets in exactly the same sequence as prescribed in the stage scenario.

14. A live round left in the chamber constitutes a stage disqualification. Any other rounds, live or empty, left anywhere in a long gun in which it was loaded is a ten-second minor safety violation.

PENALTY OVERVIEW

5-Second Penalties

Rifle, pistol, and shotgun targets must be engaged with the appropriate type of firearm.

A "miss" is defined as the failure to hit the appropriate target type using the appropriate type firearm.

- Each missed target.
- Each unfired round.
- Each target hit with an incorrect firearm, either intentionally or by mistake.

10-Second Penalties

• Any unintentional procedural errors - caused by "brain fade," confusion, ignorance, or mistakes (not to exceed one for any given stage).

- Failure to attempt to fire a firearm.
- Failure to attempt a prop or stage maneuver.
- Shooting targets in an order other than as required by stage description.
- Engaging the stage (firearms, targets or maneuvers) in an order other than as required by stage description.
- Failure to adhere to the guidelines of the category in which you are competing.

• Firing any firearm from a position other than as required by stage description.

- Minor Safety Penalties

- Leaving empty or live rounds in magazine or carrier of the long gun in which it was loaded.
- Loading more than correct number of rounds in long guns

Failure to Engage

A "failure to engage" occurs when a competitor willfully or intentionally disregards the stage instructions in order to obtain a competitive advantage (i.e., taking the penalty would result in a lower score or faster time than following the instructions) and is not assessed simply because a competitor "makes a mistake."

What's The Call

Answer next month

Pistol: 5 rounds each, holstered

Rifle: 9 rounds

Shotgun: 4+

Stage description: First Pistol: Nevada sweep, left to right, at P1, P2, P3. Holster. Second Pistol: Repeat of first pistol. Move to rifle: Engage rifle targets in a Nevada sweep, starting on left target. R1, R2, R3. Shotgun: Left to right sweep on knock down targets. S1, S2, S3, S4.

At the beep, shooter draws first pistol, with the following result. Click, bang, bang, bang, bang, bang. Hits all targets as specified. Holsters pistol.

Draws second pistol with the following result. Click, bang, bang, bang, bang, bang. Hits all targets as specified. Holsters pistol.

Shooter moves to rifle. Engages rifle targets in the following order starting on left target. R1, R2, R3, R2, R1, R2, R3, R2, R1, R2. Lays rifle down open and empty.

Shooter moves to shotgun. Engages targets as specified.

At the unloading table, the RO questions the shooter if they had their pistols checked at the loading table. RO asks, "were the hammers down on empty chambers?" Shooter replies with: "Sorry, my fault, I don't think they were."

RO also explains to the shooter that they loaded too many rifle rounds in their rifle. 10 instead of 9.
